PORTS, PEOPLE & POLICY

I spent a good part of my summer visiting the Port of Vancouver and the Port of Saint-John. I stepped onto the docks, spoke with industry teams, and saw where the work truly takes place. In Vancouver, conversations about container terminal upgrades, clean-fuel systems, and improved rail links highlighted the vital importance of our ports. I spoke with ship builders and engineers building our next generation supply vessels and Coast Guard vessels for our Canadian Armed Forces.

Out East, I toured the port of Saint-John, took note of their successes and challenges as an ever-growing gateway to Canada. I observed how the Port of Halifax anchors Atlantic trade, with green shipping corridors and rail connections ready for growth. Seeing challenges firsthand, from bottlenecks to necessary upgrades, helps guide the work I lead at the committee table to deliver real results for Canadians who rely on these ports for our food, trade, and production lines.

NATION BUILDING PROJECTS: CREATING JOBS & STRENGTHENING OUR ECONOMY

This summer, our government made real progress on the projects that connect Canadians, strengthen our economy, and create good-paying jobs.

On June 26th, Parliament passed the One Canadian Economy Act (Bill C-5), a major step toward removing outdated trade barriers between provinces and speeding up approvals for key infrastructure projects. It also launched a new Major Projects Office to help move these investments forward more efficiently and with fewer delays.

These decisions are about more than construction, they're about keeping Canadians working, growing businesses, and building the systems we rely on every day. As Chair of the Standing Committee on Transport, Infrastructure and Communities, I'm proud to help drive this work in Ottawa. We have a real opportunity to modernize the way we build, and we will get it done.



CANADA'S ARMED FORCES

REBUILD, RE-INVEST, RE-ARM

This summer, as the first step in our Liberal Government's plan to rebuild, re-invest, and re-arm, Prime Minister Mark Carney announced a long-overdue raise for members of our Canadian Armed Forces (CAF). This is a major step forward in recognizing their service and responding to the real challenges Canada is facing with recruitment and retention.

Retroactive to April 1st, starting salaries for privates have increased by 20%. Most members at the rank of lieutenant-colonel and below received a 13% raise, and a new Military Service Pay benefit has been introduced to recognize long-term service and commitment.

These changes will have a direct impact on thousands of CAF members and their families. For too long, our service members have faced rising costs, housing pressures, and heavier demands, while earning less than their counterparts in other sectors. This helps to close that gap.



It's about more than pay. It's about stability, respect, and re-affirming that military service is a valued and supported career path for the next generation.

As our government continues to invest in Canada's national defense and strengthen our presence on the global stage, making sure our CAF members are fairly compensated is not just the right thing to do, it's essential.

CONSTRUCTING MORE AFFORDABLE HOMES, FASTER

The world is in a housing crisis, and Canada is not immune. Rent and mortgage costs remain out of reach for far too many. That is why we have launched Build Canada Homes (BCH), which will be focused on building and financing affordable housing, at scale, to meet the needs of those in our community of Vaudreuil and across Canada.

BCH is central to our plan to Build Canada Strong, and will ensure that we deliver on our commitment to reach 500,000 housing starts a year for the next 10 years.

The plan to achieve this is dynamic and multi-faceted. It includes steps to build affordable housing at scale, opening up federal lands, providing flexible financing that empowers affordable homebuilders, stretching every public dollar to ensure efficiency and high impact, and sourcing Canadian materials, Canadian workers, and Canadian technology. Whether it be the first time buyer

looking to buy their first home, young families with children, seniors looking to downsize, or those most vulnerable needing a safe place to rebuild their lives, Build Canada Homes will be a one stop shop to ensure we build the housing Canadians need.
